
Dear Mr. Bernstein:

We acknowledge receipt of your communication that you directed to the Office of the Inspector General, Department of Justice (DOJ/OIG), via electronic mail on June 14, 2007. Your documentation was forwarded to the Initial Processing Unit (IPU), Internal Investigations Section (IIS), Inspection Division (INSD), Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), for our review on October 15, 2008. The IPU\IIS is the FBI entity that provides thorough and timely review and investigation into complaints of criminality or serious misconduct against FBI employees.

You claimed to have reported information regarding potential patent infringement and theft of intellectual properties from your company, Iviewit, Inc. to retired FBI Special Agent Stephen A. Lucchesi, Miami Division, in 2003. You apparently contacted SA Lucchesi on several occasions prior to SA Lucchesi's retirement from the FBI effective October 31, 2006. You also claimed to be the potential victim in an alleged car bombing which occurred in Boynton Beach, Florida, presumably in 2006. You claimed SA Lucchesi failed to thoroughly investigate your allegations. You further described the lack of investigative activities by the FBI's Miami and Los Angeles Divisions regarding your concerns. You advised the FBI denied any record of your complaint. Actually, IPU determined that you were advised on April 18, 2007, that the United States Attorney's Office declined any investigative interest with regards to your allegations.

IPU has reviewed the circumstances surrounding the information you forwarded to the DOJ/OIG and, inasmuch as you have not identified any specific information of misconduct or criminality on the part of any FBI employee, IPU has concluded that this matter does not warrant any further action. IPU considers this matter closed.
