Florida's U.S. senators have selected the attorneys and businesspeople who will make up the Southern District of Florida's nominating commission for federal judges.

Coral Gables auto executive Manny Kadre will chair the Judicial Nominating Commission for the Southern District, U.S. Sens. Marco Rubio, R-Florida, and Bill Nelson, D-Florida, announced late Wednesday. Kadre replaces former U.S. Attorney Kendall Coffey, who will remain a member of the JNC.

With a Republican in the White House, Rubio gained the opportunity to select the leadership and most members of Florida's federal JNC. Earlier this year, Rubio named Lt. Gov. Carlos Lopez-Cantera as statewide chair of the commission, a rare selection of a sitting politician. Republicans named to the Southern District JNC include former state Sen. Ellyn Bogdanoff, Florida Republican Party national committeeman Peter Feaman and former U.S. Attorney Dexter Lehtinen, who served in both the state House and Senate.

The Southern District of Florida has <u>four judicial vacancies</u>, all considered emergencies by the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts because of the district's heavy caseload. The JNC used to be responsible for nominating potential U.S. attorneys, but Rubio <u>announced in May</u> that he and Nelson would suggest candidates directly to the president. At least one Miami attorney, S. Daniel Ponce of Berger Singerman, was selected for the Middle District conference and has now served on all three federal JNC regions in the state.
